Golf, boating at Bucks Lake, visiting the shops in Quincy and eating and drinking are on the agenda. As of now, this will be the last trip for 2018. We are hoping for members coming forward with trip ideas for 2019 and present them at our annual membership lunch in January.

FISHING CLUB

At AMADOR LAKE Catfish is still a good bet, using chicken livers and anchovies around Jackson Creek.

Bass fishing is the best using spinner-baits and plastic worms at night. CAPLES LAKE has been the better of Cables and Silver Lakes, where fishing has been better for those fishing from shore.

Trout fishing at LAKE CAMANCHE has been best for trollers using rapalas and needlefish deep along the dam, or shore anglers soaking power bait and nightcrawlers. Cats and Bass fishing has been best for boaters at 35 feet using the standard terminal gear. At NEW MELONES RESERVOIR Some anglers are finding their limits in a few hours of fishing, and others are struggling to get a limit. At LAKE PARDEE Kokanee are hard to find, but trout fishing in the river arm has been good with needlefish, midge wobblers, and spinners. All fishing for September will be very slow, hope for a pick-up in October and November.
